Study Guide

Pray: Say a prayer thanking God for the growth experienced during your study of the book of Exodus and ask him to continue to reveal Himself through His Word for all participants as we take time to reflect on the book of Exodus as a whole.

The Exodus narrative is a very detailed and visual account of all the events that took place surrounding God raising up His servant Moses, calling and redeeming His people from Egypt, bringing them into a special covenant with Him, and dwelling among them. As we conclude our study of Exodus this week, we encourage you to take time to think about what God has taught and revealed to you through the chapters we have read over the past 9 months.

In order to answer our ONE discussion question this week, please review the book of Exodus as a whole and be reminded of the 'scenes' of the story that we read about, envisioned and studied. For a quick review, we recommend flipping through the pages of Exodus beginning at Chapter 1 and reading through just the subtitles of the passages to be reminded of all the events that took place. Then, we encourage you to carefully consider the question below throughout the week. We will have the opportunity to share our thoughts with each other on Friday morning.

1. What ONE 'scene' or part of the book of Exodus did you find most meaningful in your study of Exodus this year? Why?

The next two questions are for your own *personal reflection* only. You will not be asked to share your answers to these questions with our group next week, but we encourage you to reflect and meditate on these next two prompts throughout your week.

2. What has God taught you about Himself or yourself through the study of Exodus?

3. How has your life changed or will your life change because of what God taught you through the study of Exodus?
